NOTICE OF RACE

NB: The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the Notice of Race means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1 RULES

- 1.1** The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2** The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part 1 shall apply.
- 1.3** For windsurfing classes, appendix B will apply and for Kitefoiling classes appendix K will apply.

- 1.4 Racing rule 26 will be changed as follows: The warning signal for each class shall be three minutes before that classes start.
The changes will appear in full in the sailing instructions. The sailing instructions may also change other racing rules.
- 1.5 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice board located at the middle floor of Takapuna Boating Club and online at www.takapunaboating.org.nz

2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies. [DP]

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the Windfoiling, Windsurfing, Kitefoiling and kitesurfing classes.
- 3.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the attached form and sending it, together with the required fee online through www.waterbourne.co.nz by entry online by 19 February 2021,
- 3.3 Late entries will be accepted under the following conditions: Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the organising authority.
- 3.4 To be eligible to compete in this event each competitor shall be a financial member of a club recognised by the competitor’s national authority OR a current financial member of Windsurfing New Zealand
Proof of affiliated club membership to be submitted with entry.

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available after 17.00hrs at the middle floor of Takapuna Boating Club and online at www.takapunaboating.org.nz

7 VENUE

7.1 Attachment A shows the location of the regatta venue.

7.2 Attachment B shows the location of the racing areas.

8 THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be as follows: Windward/Leeward, Box or Slalom.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1 For the all classes RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

9.2 Decisions of the protest committee will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.00

10 SCORING

10.1 Five races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

10.2

a) When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

b) When five to ten races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

c) When ten or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

- d) The twelfth race (if run) shall be a medal race between the top 10 competitors in each fleet with double points awarded. The results for this race cannot be dropped.

11 SUPPORT BOATS

Support boats shall be marked with the sail number of the competitor they are supporting. [DP]

12 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. [DP]

13 PRIZES

Prizes will be given at the conclusion of the racing. Prizegiving will be at 18.00hrs on Sunday 28 February.

14 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid marine third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$1,000,000 per incident or the equivalent. Certificate of insurance is to be submitted with entry.

15 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
